## Inflectional Morphemes in PDE

Suffix	Use	Example
-s (and allomorphs)	plural	lamps
-s	third person singular	sings
's	genitive	house's
-ing	progressive	seeing
-ed	preterite	walked
-en	past participle	driven
-er	comparative	greater
-est	superlative	cheapest

## Common Derivational Morphemes in PDE

Affix	Use	Example
a-	negative	amoral
*e(x)-	ablative	extract
*de-	ablative/privative	deemphasize
*dis-	privative	disembark
mis-	wrongfulness	misplace
un-	negative	undo
-dom	nominal	fandom
-er	nominal (agent)	doer
-ful	adjectival	wistful
-hood	nominal	motherhood
-ify	verbal	nullify
-ing	gerund	running
-ion	nominal	tension
-ize	verbal	terrorize
-ly	adjectival/adverbial	fairly
-ness	nominal	fairness
-wise	adjectival/adverbial	lengthwise
-y	adjectival	funny

Asterisked elements are hardly productive in Present-Day English.
